

A 15-point check list for your Triumph winter tuneup.

| 1. | Change engine oil; flush oil reservoir. |
| 2. | Clean or replace all oil filters and screens. |
| 3. | Change gearbox and primary oil. |
| 4. | Check entire electrical system and service battery. |
| 5. | Lubricate and adjust front and rear chains. |
| 6. | Check, lubricate and adjust all control cables. |
| 7. | Adjust valves/rocker clearances. |
| 8. | Check, lubricate and adjust contact breaker assembly. |
| 9. | Clean and adjust (or replace) spark plugs. |
| 10. | Check and adjust ignition timing. |
| 11. | Drain and refill front forks. |
| 12. | Check front and rear suspension units. |
| 13. | Test front and rear brakes. |
| 14. | Inspect condition of front and rear tires; check for proper spoke tension and wheel alignment. |
| 15. | Evaluate machine's performance in road test. |

If you don't want to perform this tuneup yourself, see your Triumph dealer and he'll do it all (at a special low price).

And if you let your Triumph dealer do your winter tuneup, you can be sure he'll do a top job. First, because most Triumph service men are factory-trained. Second, because chances are he's tuned a lot of Triumphs for a long time. (He probably rode them before he began
